

Marvin McKee Biography

Marvin McKee is currently serving his third 6-year term as a Tullahoma representative on the Industrial Board of Coffee County. Marvin and his wife, Nona, moved to Tullahoma in 1958 following graduation from Georgia Tech with a BS degree in electrical engineering. He received his MS degree in electrical engineering from the University of Tennessee in 1963. Marvin worked 37 years at the Arnold Engineering Center (AEDC) as an engineer and manager for three operating contractors: ARO, Inc.; Calspan, Corp.; and, Microcraft Technology. He retired from AEDC in 1975 as Deputy General Manager of Microcraft Technology and retired from Microcraft Corporation in 1997. He is an AEDC Fellow and a past Division Director and Fellow of the Instrument Society of America. Marvin has been a member of the Tullahoma Lions Club for 52 years, and is a Past District Governor and Melvin Jones Fellow of Lions of Lions International. He served 5 years active and reserve duty as a US Army Signal Corps officer.
